Dearly Beloved:

On November 12 we will celebrate **United Women in Faith during worship**. Our guest preacher will be The Reverend Janice Griffith who is an ordained elder in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference of The United Methodist Church. She has shared with us the following biographical background:

Born and raised in Chebanse, Illinois, Rev. Griffith's faith journey began in the United Church of Christ. She first became a United Methodist after graduating from college. As a young mother, Jan became active in United Methodist Women and helped in the formation of a group for young women in the local congregation she attended. With the encouragement of the local church she attended, she discerned a call to ministry and enrolled in seminary.



After graduating from Christian Theological Seminary, Indianapolis, Indiana, Rev. Griffith returned to Illinois in 1995 to serve as Associate Pastor at Grace UMC in Decatur, IL. Successive appointments in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference include Lead Pastor at Riverside UMC, Moline, IL (2000-2006), District Superintendent assigned to the Spoon River District (2006-2012), and Executive Assistant to the Bishop (2012-2023). She took retired status in July 2023 after 28 years of appointed ministry.

Rev. Griffith has held various leadership positions in the Illinois Great Rivers Conference including Chair of the Order of Elders, Chair of the Board of Ordained Ministry, and member of several General and Jurisdictional Delegations. In 2012, Rev. Griffith was elected to the Board of Directors of the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits on which she continues to serve.

Because of the key role played by United Methodist Women in her discernment of her call to ministry, Jan has maintained an ongoing passion for the work of United Women in Faith and is looking forward to being with First UMC to celebrate United Women in Faith Sunday.

GREEN TEAM NOTES: The Styrofoam Dilemma: Part 2!

In our continuing effort to reduce our consumption of and reliance on Styrofoam products, a number of sustainable products are readily available at FUMC. Alternatives to Styrofoam plates include products made of recycled paper or bamboo, such as those pictured below. These "green" products are available in the Friendship Center North kitchen and in the Wellness Office.




When eating out, rather than using the typical Styrofoam containers provided by many restaurants for leftover food, specialized "take-out" and/or bamboo containers (pictured below) provide positive environmental and health options. One possibility is to keep at least one stainless steel container in your car to use in place of plastic or Styrofoam provided by restaurants. These steel containers come in several sizes and can be purchased at ukonserve.com. Bringing your own reusable cup for coffee also reduces the need for disposable containers. Green products are available through a number of reliable sources, such as Green Paper Products, although reducing the need for any product through use of reusable goods is optimal.





In addition to taking individual steps to avoid Styrofoam, we can also let our legislators, city council and county board members know that we support measures to phase out Styrofoam use so that more Earth friendly options can take their place in the marketplace.




Youth Events


