Dearly Beloved!

Welcome to Lent 2023! **How is it with your soul?** That is the question Lent poses. Usually the answer, at least for me, is that I can imagine doing a better job of nourishing my spirit and drawing near to God. Lent is a gift to us! Lent invites us to prioritize care for our spirits, service to our neighbors, and love for God. It is a church season of 40 days (not too long, definitely doable!) from Ash Wednesday to Easter. **Will you choose ONE thing as a Lenten spiritual discipline?** We can do this in our personal disciplines, such as: exploring new ways to pray, giving more time to prayer, worshiping together on Sundays, practicing a fast (from food or something else, like screen time or chocolate), volunteering in the community, and Bible reading for devotion and study.




But we also grow our spirit as a community of faith. We are inviting you to participate in the following Lenten practices:

- Ash Wednesday Service, February 22, at 6 pm in the Sanctuary. We will offer the imposition of ashes as part of this service.
- 30-Minute Taizé services: Every Wednesday night at 6 pm, please meet in the Sanctuary for a service of song, Scripture and reflection. Taizé (pronounced six different ways if you look it up online! I say "Tuh'zay," but feel free to find a pronunciation you like!) Taizé is a village in France where a young monk, Brother Roger, bought some property and, with his sister, began to offer safety, hospitality and care to soldiers and children after WWII. "Today, the Taizé Community is made up of about a hundred brothers, Catholics and from various Protestant backgrounds, coming from around thirty nations." (https://www.taize.fr/en\_rubrique8.html). Many people attend spiritual retreats at the faith community of Taizé seeking to grow closer to God.
- Thursday Night Dinner Together: On Thursday nights at 5:30 pm, please join me at Harvest Market on S. Neil Street for dinner. Buy your dinner downstairs (they have a good selection of hot foods and salads), then come to the dining room upstairs. Come even if you don't want to eat there...there's no requirement to purchase food. We will enjoy one another's company: a spiritual discipline of friendship and laughter.

I am looking forward to these times together with you! Please receive the gift of Lent with a glad and joyful heart that seeks to know God better, loves people more, and cares well for our beloved selves.

# Come Away to the Quiet - Taizé Services during Lent

These services focus on the meditative character of worship through the use of repetition. Portions of hymns, songs, and choruses are sung. The use of repetition allows the text to gradually penetrate one's whole being. Thus, meditative singing becomes a way of listening to God. It allows all to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive listening to God. The songs also sustain personal prayer.

You are invited to "Come away to the quiet" and join in 30-minute meditative Taizé style worship services at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary on Wednesdays during Lent. The services will include candlelight, meditation, scripture, song, and prayer. The music is led by FUMC musicians; you are welcome to join in the singing or to simply listen.

Come away to the quiet, open your heart, and talk with God on March 1, March 8, March 15, March 22, and March 29.

Our congregation will celebrate the commissioning of Pastor Julia as a new Stephen Ministry leader during worship on Sunday, March 12.

#### WHAT IS STEPHEN MINISTRY?

Stephen Ministry is an independent, non-forprofit Christian educational organization. Its main activity is the training of Stephen Ministry Leaders, who then train others in their congregation to be Stephen Ministers capable of accompanying those who are facing some crisis in life, such as illness, death of a loved one, divorce, relocation, etc. It is a lay care-giving ministry that supplements pastoral care.

It was founded in 1975 by the psychiatrist Rev. Kenneth C. Haugk and is based in St. Louis. More than 12,000 congregations from 160 Christian denominations are now involved, located in the U.S., Canada and 24 other countries. As of 2016, Stephen Ministry had trained more than 65,000 leaders, who returned to their local churches to train 600,000 congregational members.

The mission of the Stephen Ministry organization is summed up in Ephesians 4:12a: "To equip the saints for the work of ministry."




