A number of years later, I accompanied my friend, Margaret Ann Jessup, on her ordination trip to visit John Wesley sites in England. Covid has delayed our ordinands' trip the past few years, but finally, they are visiting Israel. Our neighbor, Rev. Sheryl Palmer, the pastor at Faith UMC, is on this trip with her husband. Two people I mentored are there, too.

I have been eagerly reading all the posts from my clergy friends! What a fabulous opportunity!



A friend posted a picture of the boat that they had taken out into the Sea of Galilee. It surprised me. I guess I'm used to big, plexiglass boats for the water tours I've taken in the United States. But this boat looks different. Simple, wooden, small, and vulnerable. While our IGRC group was on the Sea of Galilee they were overtaken by a storm. Was this boat able to handle a squall?

Rev. Haley Hausman, ordained in 2020 and on the boat wrote, *It's been windy and raining with the wind whistling all morning. Reading Mark 6 this morning. Thankfully, Jesus literally calms this sea. "Don't be afraid. Take courage. I am here."* (Mark 6:50) The boat tour was cut short and all the guests made it to shore.

"Don't be afraid. Take courage, I am here." Jesus spoke those words to his disciples as they faced a big storm. He speaks the same words to us! Into the storms of life Jesus speaks a calming word. No matter how small or vulnerable you may feel, Jesus brings peace.

Come to prepare for Lent and make a way for holiness to be a part of your journey through Lent and beyond. The worship service will include songs, scripture, and the imposition of ashes.



Come Away to the Quiet - Taizé Services during Lent

These services focus on the meditative character of worship through the use of repetition. Portions of hymns, songs, and choruses are sung. The use of repetition allows the text to gradually penetrate one's whole being. Thus, meditative singing becomes a way of listening to God. It allows all to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive listening to God. The songs also sustain personal prayer.

You are invited to "Come away to the quiet" and join in 30-minute meditative Taizé style worship services at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary on Wednesdays during Lent. The services will include candlelight, meditation, scripture, song, and prayer. The music is led by FUMC musicians; you are welcome to join in the singing or to simply listen.

Come away to the quiet, open your heart, and talk with God on March 1, March 8, March 15, March 22, and March 29.


Sunday, February 12 - No Youth Group due to the Super Bowl

Answer: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind; and, 'Love your neighbor as yourself." Luke 10:27, NIV

What about that Doxology?

The word DOXOLOGY is a combination of the Greek words DOXA (meaning "glory") and LOGOS (meaning "a speaking"). When we sing the Doxology in worship, we are speaking (singing) glory to God. The word first appeared in English around 1645. There are many versions of Doxologies. Some common examples are the Greater Doxology, the Lesser Doxology, and the Common Doxology.

Lesser Doxology (Gloria Patri or Glory Be to the Father)

This is a song of praise sung to the Holy Trinity: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It is often sung near the beginning of the service or around the reading of the Psalms in the Latin Mass. Examples of The Lesser Doxology are Numbers 70 and 71 in the United Methodist Hymnal.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen. Amen.

Greater Doxology (Gloria in excelsis Deo or Glory be to God on High)

The Greater Doxology began as the hymn the angels sang at the birth of Jesus. That hymn is linked to ancient Jewish liturgy. Additional verses were added and the result is the Gloria in excelsis Deo. Examples of the Greater Doxology are Numbers 82 and 83 in the United Methodist Hymnal.

Glory be to God on high And in earth peace, goodwill towards all.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we glorify thee, we give thanks to thee, for thy great glory O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty.

O Lord, the only-begotten Son, Jesu Christ; O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us. Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer. Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us.

For thou only art holy; thou only art the Lord; thou only, O Christ, with the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

The Common Doxology (The Doxology)

The Common Doxology refers to the Doxology that FUMC most often uses in worship services, Numbers 94 and 95 in the United Methodist Hymnal.

Praise God, from whom all blessings flow;

Praise Him, all creatures here below;

Praise Him above, ye heavenly host;

Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

The text was written by Thomas Ken in 1674 as the final verse of two hymns. The hymns were used during morning and evening worship services at Winchester College in England. This text, or a variation of the text, can be sung to many hymn tunes. The most common are LASST UNS ERFREUEN (UMH No. 94), OLD 100th (UMH No. 95), and TALLIS' CANON (UMH No. 682). Furthermore, the last verse of no more than 24 additional hymns in the United Methodist Hymnals are doxologies of this type.




