#### Come Away to the Quiet -Taizé Services during Lent

These services focus on the meditative character of worship through the use of repetition. Portions of hymns, songs, and choruses are sung. The use of repetition allows the text to gradually penetrate one's whole being. Thus, meditative singing becomes a way of listening to God. It allows all to take part in a time of prayer together and to remain together in attentive listening to God. The songs also sustain personal prayer.

You are invited to "Come away to the quiet" and join in 30-minute meditative Taizé style worship services at 6:00 pm in the sanctuary on Wednesdays during Lent. The services will include candlelight, meditation, scripture, song, and prayer. The music is led by FUMC musicians; you are welcome to join in the singing or to simply listen.

### More about the Dr Howard Snack Pantry Project!

As many of you know, our church has a special relationship with Dr Howard Elementary School (K-5<sup>th</sup>) on North James Street. Our Local Outreach Ministry Team has for some time donated

We believe love in action can change the world school supplies to children who attend. Meanwhile, United Women of Faith began to think about ways we could serve our neighbors. In spring 2021, our Social Action Coordinator, Paula Charter, began meeting with Suzanne Meislahn, principal of Dr. Howard, to explore ways that our unit of United Women of Faith might help meet the needs of children who attend our neighborhood school.

According to Ms. Meislahn, 75% of the school population (390 students) qualifies for the free/reduced lunch program and the free breakfast program. The children have breakfast at 7:15 a.m. and lunch between 10:30 and 11:15 a.m. At 2:30-3:00 p.m. the students are dismissed from school and sent home. By this time of day, the children are hungry. Most have very little or no food when they arrive home. In many cases it is questionable if there would be any dinner for them. Their next meal would most likely be breakfast at school the next day.

It seemed clear that some sort of substantial and healthy snack at the end of the day would be most helpful to the children. Paula and Ms. Meislahn came up with the idea for a Student Snack Pantry.

To get us started, our church's outreach team voted unanimously to donate \$2000.00 from its Student Support Fund to the Snack Pantry Project. In the last issue of the Messenger, we announced that we had just been awarded a grant for \$3600.00 from the Illinois Great Rivers Conference Emerging Ministries Fund!

The Student Snack Pantry ministry is relatively new but very much needed and appreciated. The project has evolved in wonderful and positive ways. The Fifth Grade classrooms have taken the snack pantry and made it into their very own project. They set up the pantry and often help distribute the snacks as well.



Every few weeks, Paula visits the school to check on the inventory and to find out what snacks are most appreciated by the children. Then she makes a trip to Sam's, purchases snacks, and delivers them to the school. Cost of the snacks is between \$350 and \$400 a month.

Teachers know best the needs of the children in their classrooms and often are the first to notice that a child is hungry. The snack pantry is always available to them any time of the day. Paula reports that any child who needs a snack receives one. Sometimes, a teacher will bring in a snack for everyone in the class!

The Dr Howard Snack Pantry has been a shining example of God's love and presence, his help and his guidance through and throughout this ministry. United Women of Faith of Champaign First are grateful to the FUMC Outreach Team and to IGRC for funding this project and we cannot thank Paula Charter enough for her leadership and dedication to the Snack Pantry Project. Truly, love in action!

As the original home of Austin's Place, Champaign First UMC has a long history and deep love for the women served by this ministry. This new version of the Welcome Home bins ministry continues their support of the women at Austin's Place.




