Happy Lent! I love the invitation Lent offers to search our hearts and find the places where God is inviting spiritual growth, deeper devotion, more love, and bold service. On Sunday mornings, the messages (written by our Lent Clergy Team: Revs. Keith Zimmerman, Jan Griffith, Cory Blackwell [Faith UMC], Rev. Lori Harvey [Mahomet UMC] and me) will be focusing on meeting Jesus at the table in sermons from stories in Luke. A major feature of Luke's Gospel is that Jesus is usually going to a meal, at a meal, or coming from a meal. If you love to eat, Luke is your Gospel! In keeping with that table vibe, we'll be eating together, too!

UWF to Host Special Program on Racial Trauma

Our first event of 2024 will be held on Saturday, March 9, in Friendship Center North. The meeting will begin at 9:30 a.m. with light breakfast refreshments before hearing from our quest speaker, Karen Crawford Simms.

Ms. Simms is an experienced consultant, trainer, facilitator, and coach. She is the founding director of the <u>Trauma & Resilience Initiative</u> (TRI), a local non-profit organization that provides services and support to individuals and communities impacted by adversity and violence while advocating for justice and equity for all. On March 9, her topic will be "Racial Trauma."

About a year ago, United Women in Faith formed a sub-committee on Racial Transformation to find ways to educate ourselves about the effects of racism on individuals, families, and communities. Our guiding principle has been that racism is a rejection of the teachings of Jesus Christ. We are pleased to have Karen Crawford Simms as our guest speaker on March 9.

It's not really until later, when we see how much *better* we are because of the change that we sit back and think, "Hmm...well, once again, God had the right call!" You might find out that what you thought you wanted before wasn't really serving you in the long run.

So whether it's hair or something bigger, try to embrace the change when it's needed!


