PLANS FOR LENT--

First UMC (Rev. Juia Melgreen), Faith UMC (Revs. Jan Griffith, Keith Zimmerman and Cory Blackwell) and Mahomet UMC (Rev. Lori Harvey) have been planning Lent together!

As we embark on this year's Lenten journey, we are delving into the heart of the Gospel of Luke through a unique lens—<u>Meals with Jesus</u>. Jesus is always eating, always at someone's table. We're going to look at those stories! Each meal serves as a table of encounter, an opportunity for divine communion. Lent, a season of reflection and spiritual discipline, invites us to go deeper into Scripture, to share a meal with others, and to invite Jesus to our contemporary tables. It is a time of intentional introspection and connection—both with God and with one another. Our sermon series uses a framework from this book: <u>A Meal with Jesus</u>: <u>Discovering Grace, Community and Mission Around the Table</u> by Tim Chester.

iRead Program Dates: March 19 - April 26, 2024

This program helps kindergarten and first grade students who are struggling with literacy and math competencies in Champaign and Urbana primary schools. We need hundreds of volunteers in the classrooms this spring to work one-on-one with these students to help with literacy.

Why is This Volunteer Program so Important?

We have an achievement gap in our schools that has widened over the past couple of years. If we do not address it now, we will never close this gap.

Why This Matters:

- Reading and math are our most basic workforce skills.

Quick Facts about Volunteering:

- · Volunteers submit applications by February 9, 2024 for processing.
- Approved volunteers will go online and sign up for school choice, day and time preference, and training session.
- Volunteers will attend one training session and one orientation session at their school.
- Volunteers spend one hour a week in the classrooms working one-on-one with early learners, helping build the students' basic reading skills.
- The reward of helping a child build these skills is immeasurable.

We have the responsibility and ability to help the future workforce generation succeed by strengthening the foundation for literacy and math education for our youngest, most vulnerable students now.

Youth News

Recently, I just got to hear my brother speak as the guest of honor at a Tourette's Gala in Houston, Texas. As some of you may or may not know, my brother has Tourette's syndrome. This exhibits itself in bodily/vocal tics that he cannot control.

His speech was literally incredible. First of all, it was hilarious. If you know him, that really isn't a surprise. Secondly, it had a really good message in it and that's what I wanted to share with you.

My brother is in grad school for landscape architecture. Due to his tics, it can take him more than double the time to make hand renderings of his designs than it does his classmates. He discussed the hopelessness that can happen when you have Tourette's. It can feel like your disorder is holding you back from doing what you want to do.

That being said, he pointed out that you HAVE to do things anyway as a part of society, so there are two choices. One is to do the bare minimum. The second is to find something you really want to do, and then just work *really, really hard* to accomplish what you want. He followed that up with this: "Always choose the latter. The former is just a waste of time." He continued to say that by just doing the bare minimum, you are still putting in the time, effort, and sometimes money, so you might as well do the best you can, so that your result is better than just alright.

He ended his speech by saying, "If you ask yourself, 'is this a thing I would want to do if my [insert challenge here] wasn't in the way?' if the answer is 'yes,' go ahead and do that thing."

I was struggling on how to end this...but I think his words say it best. So I'll just leave it there.


Need a Ride to Church on Sunday?


