Dearly Beloved,

I recently said to someone, "I don't like this part of life where we say good-bye to so many loved ones. It feels like each death leaves a new hole in my heart." We have lost a couple of great friends from our church family lately: Kenny Wood and Ted Beach. The older people I know have weathered the loss of so many friends and family members, that I sometimes wonder where they find the strength to press on.

Then I remember! They have been practicing their faith for a lifetime! And practice makes us better at what we aim to do…trust God in every circumstance. Trusting God doesn't magically remove the pain of loss. But it helps. We pray and that helps, too. And we talk about those who have gone before us. We name them and remember them with bittersweet joy.

This works for other pain as well. We talk about it and we listen. A teacher on Facebook was responding to the tragic deaths of five people, three of them very young children, in a Schulyer-Industry bus and semi crash in Rushville,IL, this week. As she processed the pain she was feeling and how to discuss it with her own young children, she wrote, "I went back to my thought that I share with my students when we read or talk about tough things: If these people experienced it, we owe them the respect of talking about it, even if it makes us uncomfortable and sad. We come together when sad things happen and we show our love and support, because it means something. Then we prayed."

She was suggesting that we face and make space for the pain of others. Even if it makes us uncomfortable and sad. The Bible says it this way: *Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.* (Galatians 6:2) We show our love and support because it means something. And we pray.



Children and Youth of all ages are welcome to attend the annual Easter Egg Hunt before the service on Easter Sunday!




## Youth News


## Need a Ride to Church on Sunday?

#### El Roi House History

After 13 years of ministry to team moms through Champaign County YoungLives, the staff and mentors identified the great need for stable housing. Right about this time, a wonderful Stone Creek Church couple communicated to their pastor a desire to donate their home for this use. Stone Creek agreed to cover the costs for the first year so, beginning in November 2022, the El Roi House ("God sees me") was home to our four single, young moms who would otherwise have been homeless.


El Roi House is now its own, 501(c)3, non-profit organization and seeking funding to relieve the financial responsibility from Stone Creek Church. They are also searching for Christian women to staff the house and who can help provide a safe, nurturing environment in which young, single moms and their children can grow and thrive.




