Clothing for Danville Correctional Center's Newly Released Offenders



During the month of April, we again have the opportunity to participate in a program of the Danville Correctional Center to provide good used men's clothing for at least half of those 500 offenders who are released each year with few assets to their name (only prison clothing). Offenders about to be released can select clothing which can give them a sense of self-worth as they step back out into the world.

A labeled box is provided in the Resource Room for donations of all sizes of men's clothing. Especially needed are men's jeans, pants, shirts, shoes, and jackets. Please do not include any belts, ties, suspenders, or hangers. We ask that you make your donations between April 1-28, 2024. The church office will be open from 10 am to 3:00 pm weekdays for you to drop off your items, or you can bring them on Sunday morning.

We will be joining other churches in our area in this program. Please remember the deadline for this spring collection is April 28. We would like to thank Bob Clark from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church for picking up and transporting our donated clothing to Danville.

Green Team Notes: April, Earth Month

April is the official "Earth Month", with Monday, April 22, being "Earth Day" for 2024. When asked what each of us can do to contribute to the health of our planet, our Faith in Place support person, Cindy Shepherd, responded with a smile and these two recommendations: 1) use air travel less; 2) avoid eating meat! - knowing these two things were probably difficult, at best, for most of us. Yet, these were Cindy's immediate suggestions for some very good reasons. The fossil fuels burned by airplanes release CO2 emissions and strong warming non-CO2 effects due to nitrogen oxide vapor trails, contributing significantly to global warming. Cows alone are responsible for 40% of methane emissions, a potent greenhouse gas, not to mention the deforestation and land use conversion, along with other environmental effects, such as excessive water usage worldwide.

So, what else can you do to help our ailing planet? Here are some everyday things you can do to fight global warming and improve our planet's health:

- -Change your home's energy source, such as use solar energy and LED light bulbs, wash clothes with cold water, replace an oil or gas furnace with an electric heat pump
 - -Switch to an electric vehicle
- -Walk, bike, or take public transportation when possible
 - -Compost food waste and throw away less food
 - -Eat more vegetables
 - -Plant native species
- -Buy locally and from companies committed to reducing gas emissions and waste
 - -Reduce, recycle, reuse

While you may not be able to or ready to give up air travel or become a vegetarian, reducing air travel and meat consumption can still contribute to a healthier planet. Along with these other, feasible actions, we each have an opportunity now to make a difference. For an interesting and often uplifting view of ways to help our planet, Jane Goodall's 2021 book, "The Book of Hope: A Survival Guide for Trying Times" is one suggested helpful and appropriate Earth Month read!

Do you know the books of the Bible in order? I would guess that most people don't. When I was younger, my mom taught my brother and me a song to help us memorize the books of the Bible in order. I can still remember the song to this day, and it helps me locate what I want to find in the Bible quickly. Pastor Julia also learned this song and the poor Confirmation class has heard our singing skills a few times now.

Is it necessary to memorize the books of the Bible? No, most people probably use the table of contents at the beginning. But it is a helpful tool to have and it helped me think about the setup of the Bible - like why certain books are placed where they are, even if they might be older than the books that come before them. That's why we're going over it a little bit in Confirmation. If you have any tricks or tips about navigating the Bible (like how Psalms is about halfway through, etc.), let me know! We're always looking for more practical ways to make it easier to read and understand the Bible!




